Draft Final Rulemaking for Control of Sulfur Emissions from No. 2 and Lighter Commercial Fuel Oil – Bryan Oshinski, Air Quality Program Specialist, Bureau of Air Quality, will discuss the draft final-form regulation that will reduce the allowable sulfur content of No. 2 commercial fuel oil to 15 parts per million from the currently allowable level of 500 ppm.
