Consumer Products - State Implementation Plan (SIP) Revision for the 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS)

Summary of Action

ACHD is incorporating by reference the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Air Pollution Control Act at 25 Pa. Code §§130.201- 130.471, Consumer Products. This regulation controls the VOC content of consumer products for sale in the state of Pennsylvania in order to reduce VOC levels, and by extension ozone levels, throughout the Commonwealth. By incorporating this regulation, ACHD will have the authority to request information on volatile organic compound (VOC) levels in consumer products that are listed in PA DEP's Air Pollution Control Act at 25 Pa. Code §§130.201- 130.471 for sale in Allegheny County, to ensure that products do not exceed accepted VOC levels. All information on consumer products sought under this regulation shall be subject to ACHD's preexisting Confidentiality regulations, Article XXI §2101.07.d.4. All consumer products seeking a variance from the regulation must submit to the Pennsylvania DEP, as variances will not be handled by ACHD in order to remain consistent across the Commonwealth. This regulation will be incorporated into Allegheny County's portion of the Pennsylvania's SIP, making it federally enforceable.

PART E - SOURCE EMISSION AND OPERATING STANDARDS

Subpart 8 – Additional Miscellaneous VOC Sources

The following section is being added to Article XXI:

§2105.88 CONSUMER PRODUCTS

{Section added March 23, 2012, effective April 3, 2012.}

- a. Incorporation by Reference. Except as otherwise specifically provided under this Section, this Section shall be applied consistent with the provisions of the state regulation for Consumer Products promulgated under the Air Pollution Control Act at 25 Pa. Code §§130.201-130.471 which are hereby incorporated by reference into this Article. Additions, revisions, or deletions to such regulation by the Commonwealth are incorporated into this Article and are effective on the date established by the state regulations, unless otherwise established by regulation under this Article.
 - 1. For the purposes of 25 Pa. Code §130.391, *Required reporting of information to the Department*, "Department" shall mean Department as defined under this Article.
 - 2. For the purposes of 25 Pa. Code §130.392, *Confidentiality*, "Section 13.2 of the Air Pollution Control Act (25 P.S. §4013.2)" shall mean §2101.07.d.4 of this Article.
- b. **Variances.** Variances of compliance pursued under 25 Pa. Code §§130.201-130.471 shall be submitted to and issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.
