PROPOSED EIGHT-HOUR OZONE ATTAINMENT/NONATTAINMENT DESIGNATION RECOMMENDATIONS

Announcement of Public Meetings

Ground-level ozone concentrations above the federal health-based standard are a serious human health threat. Ozone can also cause damage to crops, forests and wildlife. In July 1997, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) promulgated the 8-hour ozone national ambient air quality standard (NAAQS). The revised ozone standard of 0.08 parts per million, measured over an 8-hour period, is more protective of public health than the one-hour health-based ozone standard. Section 107 of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) requires EPA to make designations (attainment, nonattainment or unclassifiable) for new or revised NAAQS within one year of promulgation of the standard. However, implementation of the 8-hour ozone health-based standard had been delayed due to legal challenges.

The Governor of each state must now submit designation recommendations to EPA in accordance with Section 107(d) of the CAA. These recommendations will be based on air quality monitoring data (and other criteria) obtained for the three-year period preceding the recommendations.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is seeking public input on the proposed 8-hour ozone designation recommendations. Air quality information obtained during 2000-2002 indicates that EPA may designate at least 33 counties in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as 8-hour ozone nonattainment areas. Pennsylvania will recommend to EPA that boundaries for the designated areas generally follow metropolitan area and county boundaries. This approach is similar to the methodology used for designating areas under the 1-hour ozone health-based standard.
