## 86.17(e)(1)

The reclamation fee will be used by the Department to pay the construction costs and operation and maintenance costs associated with treating postmining pollutional discharges at ABS Legacy Sites, and the moneys may not be used for any other purpose.



## 86.187(a)(1)(iv)

The moneys deposited in the Reclamation Fee O&M Trust Account will be used to pay construction costs and operation and maintenance costs associated with treating postmining pollutional discharges at ABS Legacy Sites, and the moneys may not be used for any other purpose. For purposes of this section, operation and maintenance includes recapitalization costs.



#### **ABS Project Funding Strategy**


- SMCRA Account (48%)
  - ABS Treatment Construction (>\$2 M pending)
- Reclamation Fee O & M Account (42%)
  - O & M Contracts/Grants
  - DEP Direct Costs (Sampling and O & M)
- Released Bond Account (8%)
  - ABS Treatment Design (>\$300,000 pending)



## **ABS Project Other Funds Sources**

- Growing Greener
- OSM Title V
  - Required Inspections
  - Federal Civil Penalties





#### Civil Penalty Transfer Options

- Retain in the SMCRA Fund
  - Funds available for other SMCRA obligations
  - ABS Construction costs (>\$2 M)
- Transfer all or part directly to ABS Legacy Sites
   Trust Account
  - Progress toward self-sustaining ABS



#### Civil Penalty Transfer Options

- Transfer total remaining amount to Rec Fee O
   & M account as previously recommended
  - Relief from Reclamation Fee for several years
  - Does this impact an alternate funding source?
- Transfer some to Rec Fee O & M Account and some to the ABS Legacy Sites Trust Account
  - Provides immediate relief from the Reclamation
     Fee payments
  - Progress toward a self-sustaining ABS
