




Photo 5: Southern elevation of Main Dwelling House, circa 1759




Photo 6: Northern elevation of Main Dwelling House, circa 1759, of Benedict and Anna Eschleman




Photo 9: View from Main Dwelling House basement to exterior entrance looking south




Photo 10: Eastern elevation of the 19th-century Summer Kitchen




Photo 11: Southern elevation of the 19th-century Summer Kitchen




Photo 12: Remains of latter 19th-century cast iron range stove for volume cooking and food processing in Summer Kitchen




Photo 13: West and south elevation of early 20th-century Chicken Coop




Photo 14: North and east elevation of Chicken Coop




Photo 15: West elevation of 19th-century Smoke House




Photo 16: South and west elevation of Smoke House




Photo 18: North and west elevation of 19th-century Stables with Implement Shed in the background




Photo 19: East and south elevation of Tobacco Barn; note 20th-century Open Corn Silo, left background




Photo 20: West and south elevation of circa 1870s Tobacco Barn




Photo 21: North elevation of Tobacco Barn




Photo 22: South and east elevation of Bank Barn; note intact Barnyard Wall in left foreground and mid-20th-century Milk House to far right
