## Response to Section 102.43 issue:

Generally, earth disturbance activities necessary to install individual onlot systems will not be of one acre or more and so will not trigger the requirements of Section 102.43. However, installation of community onlot systems as well as overall development of a property to construct a home and other appurtenances (driveways, swimming pools, etc.) could create earth disturbances in excess of one acre that would trigger Section 102.43. When Section 102.43 is triggered, the SEO should advise the applicant that the application is administratively incomplete if the applicant does not demonstrate that the required Section 102 permit has been approved when the application is submitted. No local agency or SEO can issue a permit that violates the Clean Streams Law (25 Pa.Code § 72.2(c)(4)).
