An additional Statewide Committee meeting was added for 4/18/08 to present the final Chapter 110 regulations in order to prepare for a final rulemaking package to be submitted to the EQB later this summer.

#### **Update from Regional Committee Representatives**

<u>Delaware</u>- Carol Collier reported for Howard Neukrug that the Regional Committee prioritized the six watersheds for further analysis and reduced the Regional Priorities from three to two. Carol also stated that the Delaware Regional Committee had significant discussions and a strong recommendation to the Statewide Committee that the Delaware Regional Committee be afforded the opportunity of commenting one more time on the various papers being developed by the P and I Subcommittee prior to the Subcommittee sending the papers to the Statewide Committee.

Chairman Bluedorn commented that the Executive Steering Committee discussed this issue and it is the Executive Steering Committee recommendation that the Statewide Committee move the papers forward. The Regional Committees have already been given opportunity for input and that the Statewide Committee should not send the papers back to the P and I Subcommittee or Regional Committees for additional input prior to publication as part of the draft State Water Plan.

<u>Lower Susquehanna</u>- Bill Morris stated that the Committee discussed the Regional Priorities, the selected watersheds and chose 9/15/08 for the date for the Fall Public Meeting and Hearing.

<u>Upper Middle</u>- Gary Petrewski reported that the Committee discussed the Regional Priorities and the selected watersheds.

<u>Potomac</u>- Bob Reichart stated that they elected their Chair and Vice-Chair. They also discussed the Regional Priorities and the selected watersheds.

Bob, as a PGWA member, then invited the Statewide Committee members to attend the PA Ground Water Association Summer Field Conference on June 6, 2008.
