 those >10,000 gpd
 and those who obtain water through interconnection >100,000 gpd

 Staggered Reporting Submissions


 All Public Water Supply Agencies March 31
 Any other user June 30

 Report will contain information required under registration and user-specific requirements

Retention of Records for a period of no less than 5 years

Compliance Costs

- One-time metering costs for a limited number of public water suppliers
- Annual record keeping and reporting costs may range from 1 to 12 work-days per registrant

Those users in Susquehanna and Delaware basins may already have appropriate programs in place and will not incur additional costs
