June 15, 1999

Showers and thunderstorms crossed the state yesterday, spreading precipitation ranging generally in the 0.25-0.5 inch range, with some localized areas receiving as little as no rain to as high as 0.75 inch.

Stream flow and ground water data are not available today.

Today's forecast indicates up to 0.1 inch of precipitation in the eastern third of the state, probably as lingering showers from the front that passed through in the last 24 hours. The following two days indicate little activity, with up to 0.1 inch in the southwestern area of the state toward the end of the period. The 5-day outlook shows up to 1.0 inch concentrated in the southwest and decreasing to 0.1-0.5 inch toward the northeast. The 6-10 day forecast indicates an additional 0.5-2.0 inches increasing from south to north.
