Address Pollutant Reduction

DEP to enlist Conservation Districts to inspect farms.

- Requirements for existing funding will shift from 100 educational visits to 50 inspections per year.
- Emphasize technical assistance <u>AND</u> regulatory compliance.
- Need for additional DEP staff reduced based on success of partnership with Conservation Districts.



Ag Inspection SOP

DEP Developing Standard Operating Procedures

- Ensure consistency
- Address Conservation Districts' concerns

Review of Standard Operating Procedures

- Draft provided to Conservation Districts
- Training DEP/CD staff planned

Inspection Focus

- Manure Management Plan
- Erosion and Sedimentation Plan
- Significant water quality problems

Key Definitions

Inspection - on-site verification that written plans are in place at an agricultural operation and an evaluation of conditions affecting water quality.

Compliance - a condition in which an operation has satisfied Pa. regulatory requirements for development of written plans.

Enforcement - activities undertaken by DEP to compel an operation to achieve compliance with Pa. regulation and statute.



District Role

- Coordinate with DEP to identify farms to be inspected
- Conduct initial inspections to verify existence of required written plans
- Record the results of the inspections
- Refer inspection results to DEP where needed for follow-up compliance assurance or enforcement exists



DEP Role

- Send pre-inspection letter to farmers in Bay Watershed
- Complete additional inspections
- Conduct follow-up inspections as needed based on referrals from Districts
- Take enforcement actions, where appropriate
- Develop/revise SOPs and inspection forms
- Develop/deliver training



Bay Technician Agreements

- Revised announcement released April 26
- One requirement: 50 inspections per 1 FTE in accordance with the SOPs
- For payment to start July 1, need decision by July 1
- Contract vs. Delegation Agreement
 - Contract is more appropriate with specified tasks
 - Work with the SCC to finalize contract language
 - Start with standard DEP contract



Other Funding Impacts

- Pending availability of funds:
 - Provide a salary increase for Bay and NM Technicians
 - 2. Allow districts to "opt-in" in subsequent years
- DEP will use funds allocated for technicians in districts who "opt-out" to hire staff
- Decision to participate in this program does <u>NOT</u> impact funding for other programs:
 - Chesapeake Bay Special Projects
 - Watershed Specialists, Nutrient Management
 Technicians, Bay Engineers

Conclusion

- Purpose of this exercise is to achieve compliance with our regulations
- As a result of successful discussions with districts, PACD, SCC, a number of improvements were made to the SOPs
- Time for Districts to make a decision
- Goal is to begin implementation by July 1
