Re: Accreditation for Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule Methods

Dear Sir or Madam:

The EPA requires laboratories performing work for the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule ("LT2 Program") be accredited for an appropriate method through their primary state for the analyte *E. coli* (enumeration) under the Drinking Water Matrix. 40 CFR § 141.704(b) approves all methods for enumeration of *E. coli* in source water approved in 40 CFR § 136.3(a). A list of these required methods may also be found at Table 4-1 in EPA Office of Water Document EPA 815-R06-006.

Pennsylvania accreditation for LT2 Program methods will be consistent with historical requirements; namely, completion of a successful on-site assessment for each method (meeting the requirements of Chapter 252 or NELAC Standards) and an acceptable Proficiency Test Study ("PT").

Initially accreditation may be granted for *E. coli* (enumeration) methods without an initial on-site assessment, if:

- 1a) Laboratory is currently accredited under NELAC or State for total coliform or fecal coliform analysis using the same technique under a source water accreditation program such as those required under 40 CFR 141.74; or
- 1b) Laboratory is currently accredited under NELAC or State for total coliform, fecal coliform, and/or *E. coli* analysis using the same technique under other drinking water accreditation programs, such as those required under 40 CFR 141.21 (Total Coliform Rule); and
- 2) Laboratory successfully completes a Drinking Water/Source Water PT study by the *E. coli* (enumeration) method. Note: Drinking Water/Source Water PTs are available for *E. coli* enumeration and "quick response" PTs are deemed acceptable.
- 3) Laboratory submits an acceptable Standard Operating Procedure for the *E. coli* (enumeration) method, and
- 4) Laboratory submits an 'Addition of Fields of Accreditation' application to the Department along with the appropriate fee requesting addition of the *E. coli* (enumeration) method. NOTE: The 'Addition of Fields of Accreditation' application is not required if the request to add the method is made during the laboratory's normal renewal period.
