CO<sub>2</sub> Budget Trading Program – Allen Landis, Energy Programs Office, will discuss the CO<sub>2</sub> Budget Trading Program that the DEP is developing in order to participate in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative. This effort was directed by Governor Wolf's Executive Order on October 3, 2019, titled "Commonwealth Leadership in Addressing Climate Change through Electric Sector Emissions Reductions." Draft Final-Form Rulemaking: Control of VOC Emissions from Gasoline Dispensing Facilities (Stage I and II) – This rulemaking updates control requirements relating to gasoline station fuel pumps and storage tanks to account for technological changes since the initial rule was finalized. The draft proposed rulemaking was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on September 26, 2020 (Pa. B. 5236). The public comment period closed on November 30, 2020. Virtual public hearings were held on October 27, 28, and 29, 2020. No testimony was presented at the virtual public hearings. The Environmental Quality Board (EQB) received public comments from five commenters on the draft proposed rulemaking. The Independent Regulatory Review Commission's (IRRC) comment period closed December 3. The EQB received four comments from IRRC. DEP will present the final-form rulemaking Annex A to AQTAC, the CAC subcommittee, and SBCAC on April 8, April 20, and May 19, 2021 respectively. DEP anticipates presenting the final-form rulemaking to the EQB in the second quarter 2021. Mr. Trostle can be contacted at 717-772-3926 or [dtrostle@pa.gov](mailto:dtrostle@pa.gov).

Hydrofluorocarbon (HFC) Phasedown Update – DEP presented regulatory concepts for a phasedown of HFCs to the SBCAC in April 2020. In December 2020, the American Innovation and Manufacturing (AIM) Act of 2020 was finalized. Because the federal regulations to be developed by the EPA in accordance with the AIM Act will be more comprehensive, DEP is suspending the development of a Pennsylvania-specific HFC rulemaking until EPA finalizes their rules.
