EV NEWS & MEMBER UPDATES



- DEP's Level 2 Charging Equipment Rebate program has funded over 1,650 level 2 charging plugs
 - Follow this link for <u>DEP's 1,000 plug press release</u>
- The level 2 rebate program guidelines were updated at the end of July 2022
 - Public projects in rural counties now receive a higher rebate incentive
 - The currently available program funds may be exhausted sometime in calendar year 2023



- The Alternative Fuel Incentive Grant (AFIG) is open for applications!
 - \$3 million is available for:
 - Alternative fuel fleet vehicle purchases
 - Fueling infrastructure for alternative fuel fleet vehicles
 - Alternative fuel innovative technology projects
 - Application due date is December 16th, 2022
 - The program guidelines and a recorded webinar are available on the <u>AFIG webpage</u>



- DEP awarded 16 DC fast charging projects installing 54 plugs throughout Pennsylvania
- The Alternative Fuel Rebate for Consumers program was updated on September 1st
 - Electric vehicle purchase rebates are now larger and have an income cap
- Please see this <u>Press Release</u> for more details about both announcements above



- DEP hopes to release the EV rate design study by the end of this calendar year
- The Driving PA Forward Medium and Heavy-Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Pilot Grant program will likely open for applications by the end of this calendar year

National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program - Submitted to Joint Office of Energy and Transportation on July 21st

- Approval received from FHWA on September 14th
- \$25.4 million (FY22') now available to PennDOT for obligation
- Pre-announcement of funding opportunity beginning of October
- Stakeholder engagement sessions w/ Utilities, October – November
- Webinar for interested proposers November 1
- Proposal announcement late December/early January



PRIORITY LOCATIONS

PRIORITY I:

Selected via gap analysis to most likely meet AFC build-out


PRIORITY II:

Interchanges in locations closer to existing sites/or likely to be redundant.

PRIORITY III:

Interchanges that already has NEVI-qualifying EV charging site.

- Round 1 will focus on Pennsylvania's primary and auxiliary interstate AFC network and includes 11 primary interstates and four (4) auxiliary interstates
- PennDOT's interchange group map shows the ~80 gaps labeled as Priority I, II, or III
- At least one site at an interchange within each Priority I group will be selected first, followed by one site within each of the Priority II groups of interchanges.




