Good afternoon Larry,

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me on the phone this morning. As I mentioned, upon my review of the HDD analysis for the HDD 320, I have the following comments and am requesting that you provide additional information to address them.

- Section 4.1 of the Hydrogeologic Reevaluation Report attachment states that based on water level measurements, the drilling plan should account for the occurrence of a potential groundwater discharge at the northwestern entry/exit once the pilot boring is completed. It does not appear that this issue was specifically addressed in the drilling plan; it is recommended a plan of action be incorporated into the drilling plan, and that sufficient staff are on-site when the boring is nearing completion.
- Regarding the last bullet point in the Conclusion section of the HDD analysis: The discussion of small/large LOCs is not specific, the reasons for which you explained on the phone. DEP requests that a responsible professional be on site to monitor the LOCs and make a determination as to which LOCs will require remediation.
