Thank you for submitting information concerning the above referenced project. The Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office (PA SHPO) reviews projects in accordance with state and federal laws. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, and the implementing regulations (36 CFR Part 800) of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, is the primary federal legislation. The Environmental Rights amendment, Article 1, Section 27 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and the Pennsylvania History Code, 37 Pa. Cons. Stat. Section 500 et seq. (1988) is the primary state legislation. These laws include consideration of the project's potential effects on both historic and archaeological resources.

Archaeological Resources

Thank you for submitting the current project Limits of Disturbance. Our office previously recommended avoidance for one archaeological site: 36LA1600. At the time, our office concurred on an avoidance plan proposed that "reconfigures workspace to avoid effects on the site and requires protective fencing at a buffer of 5 meters from the site boundary. As long as this procedure is carried out, no additional archaeology is necessary unless current plans change." PA SHPO continues to recommend that avoidance and as we understand from your letter, this avoidance is still planned for the project. If project plans change and the site cannot be avoided and/or if additional historic properties are located during project construction, you will need to reinitiate consultation with our office using PA-SHARE.
