CALL TO ORDER AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Chair Adam Browning at 9:05 A.M. The meeting was conducted both in-person and on-line. No members of the public attended the meeting at the Boyertown location.

A quorum was present.

Motion: Chair Browning called for a motion to approve the minutes for the September 15, September 16, October 17, November 3, November 14, and December 18, 2025 meetings.

Duane Mowery requested that the December 18th minutes be revised. Specifically, the sixth bullet in the list of recommendations from SAC within the Discussion/Information Items section. It currently states, “incorporate timed dosing into all pressurized systems.” Vice Chair Mowery said it should be revised to “incorporate timed dosing into all pressurized systems that utilize a pump.” The minutes will be updated with this amendment.

Motion: Vice Chair Mowery made a motion to approve the meeting minutes with the addition of the amendment above. Michael Ciocco seconded the motion. Minutes were unanimously approved by the Committee.

DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS

- DEP presented an updated listing developed in coordination with Infiltrator. This was presented for informational purposes only. The listing update will recognize the Quick 5 chamber, a product that is one foot longer than the currently approved Quick 4 chamber. The Pennsylvania Infiltrator design manual will also be updated. Member Mowery questioned if Infiltrator worked with DEP to develop the revised listing. DEP indicated yes. The committee invited Infiltrator representative Dich Bachelder to speak. A brief summary was presented; there were no questions or comments from the committee.
 - **Action:** No vote taken.
- The Committee presented an overview of the SAC comment letter to Secretary Shirley summarizing work group discussions held over the past year regarding the Chapter 71, 72, and 73 regulation updates.
 - Letter includes high-priority recommendations, regulation-by-regulation summaries, and supporting meeting minutes.
 - DEP outlined the regulatory process and confirmed SAC will have additional opportunities to review and comment during later rulemaking stages.

- **Action:** Chair Browning called for a motion to the approve letter. Vice Chair Mowery made a motion to approve the letter. Robert Bressler seconded the motion. Motion approved to submit the SAC comment letter (dated January 28, 2026) to Secretary Shirley. All were in favor, none opposed.
- DEP requested SAC support to advance the draft regulations with SAC recommendations included. Request for SAC support submitting the rulemaking to the Environmental Quality Board and next steps. Member Mowery questioned if this was typical. DEP responded, yes, this is typical, but this is not intended to be an endorsement to agree with everything as presented.
 - Members discussed concerns regarding interpretation of support and clarified that the motion was procedural and not endorsement of the draft regulations as written.
 - **Action:** Chair Browning called for a motion to support the advancement of the draft regulations. Martin Siegel made a motion to support the advancement of the draft regulations. Shannon Drosnock seconded the motion. All those in favor. Joe Valentine and Robert Bressler voted in opposition to the motion. Motion approved to support advancement of the draft regulations with inclusion of SAC recommendations. Additional discussion ensued and Patrick Drohan and Sarah Miller expressed opposition but the motion had already passed.
