New Business:

Chapter 102, Erosion and Sediment Control and Stormwater Management

Glenn Rider (grider@state.pa.us), Bureau Director, Bureau of Watershed Management, presented an overview and summary of the over 1,300 comments that DEP received regarding the proposed amendments to Chapter 102, Erosion and Sediment Control and Stormwater Management. Mr. Rider, **Ken Murin** (kmurin@state.pa.us), Environmental Program Manager, Waterways, Wetlands and Stormwater Management Division, Bureau of Watershed Management, and **Meg Murphy** (mamurphy@state.pa.us), Bureau of Regulatory Counsel, Office of Chief Counsel, answered questions on the presentation.

DEP Source Water Assessment and Protection Program

Joe Lee (joslee@state.pa.us), Chief, Source Water Protection Section, Bureau of Watershed Management, provided a report on the status of DEP's Source Water Assessment and Protection Program for source of public water supply and a discussion of other program changes.

Update on WRAC Adhoc Subcommittee on TDS

Marcus Kohl (<u>mkohl@state.pa.us</u>) provided an update on the status of the adhoc subcommittee. At the last meeting of the subcommittee, a decision was made that no common agreement could be reached. Therefore a letter will be prepared and submitted to WRAC summarizing the discussions held. At this point, the likely schedule for Chapter 95 is to go before the EQB in June 2010. Prior to that meeting the Department would bring a summary of comments and potential changes to WRAC in April 2010 and scheduling a special meeting in May 2010 to review draft final language. The committee chair requested an Advance Notice of Final Rulemaking for the Chapter 95 regulatory changes.

Suggestion for Future Meeting's Agenda

Steve Rhoads requested a presentation on the new Chesepeake TMDLs. There is the possibility of this occurring at the April 14 meeting. It was also discussed that EPA provide this presentation.
