Trisha Salvia is the Chesapeake Bay Foundation's Staff Attorney in Pennsylvania. Her focus is on legislative and regulatory issues that impact local Pennsylvania waters and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay. This includes a diverse array of topics such as agriculture, nutrient management, stormwater, climate change, environmental justice, urban and riparian forested buffers, and water quantity.

Prior to her current role she was at the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for 7 years as an Assistant Counsel for the Bureau of Regulatory Counsel. During her time at DEP she counseled numerous water-related programs, such as NPDES, dam safety, water allocation, water source protection, drought mitigation and unconventional gas development water withdrawals. She also worked closely with the numerous interstate compact commissions, such as the Council of Great Lakes Governors, Great Lakes Regional Body and Compact Council, Susquehanna River Basin Commission, Delaware River Basin Commission and Delaware River Decree Parties.

Earlier in her career, Trisha was an assistant counsel for the PA Liquor Control Board, an associate with Cipriani & Werner, and served as a law clerk to the Honorable Louis J. Farina, President Judge, of the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas.

Trisha received her B.S. in Environmental Studies from Elon University, a J.D. from Widener University School of Law, and an LL.M. in Environmental Law from Pace University School of Law.
