# **Governor's Office Update**

### Governor Wolf, Lawmakers Announce Actions to Prioritize Environmental Justice!

Governor Wolf joined members of the PA Legislative Black Caucus and environmental advocates on Thursday, October 28 to announce efforts to address environmental justice. Governor Wolf issued an <u>Executive Order</u> strengthening the Wolf Administration's efforts to address environmental justice and support low-income communities and communities of color that are adversely impacted by environmental issues and adverse health impacts. The executive order permanently establishes the DEP's Office of Environmental Justice, Environmental Justice Advisory Board (EJAB), and an Environmental Justice Interagency Council. "Many Pennsylvania communities have been disproportionately harmed by pollution, and today's executive order by Governor Wolf is a first step in making sure that we have some of the tools to mitigate and prevent it from happening in the future," said DEP Secretary Patrick McDonnell.

State Representatives Donna Bullock, Malcolm Kenyatta and Chris Rabb and state Senator Vincent Hughes have proposed bills to support the governor's executive actions. Their bills would require a more transparent and open process before certain facilities are built or expanded within areas defined as "burdened communities," codify the Office of Environmental Justice within DEP, and codify the Environmental Justice Advisory Board. These legislative actions would protect these executive actions from being unilaterally disbanded.

# **DEP Updates**

## **Environmental Justice Advisory Board Meeting**

The next EJAB meeting will be held virtually on Tuesday, November 16. The meeting will be held from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm and will include presentations on the Pennsylvania Climate Action Plan 2021, Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) Rulemaking, and an update on the EJ Policy and Executive Order. The meeting agenda and other documents for the meeting will be posted on the EJAB webpage.

The EJAB will then host a joint meeting with the Citizens Advisory Council (CAC) in the afternoon on Tuesday, November 16 from 12:30 – 2:30 pm. The meeting will include an update from Secretary McDonnell and a presentation from the GreenGov Council. The agenda and other documents for the joint EJAB-CAC meeting are posted on the <u>CAC webpage</u>.

### **EJ Policy Revision**
