Proposed Rulemaking: Administration of the Land Recycling Program – Chromium (VI)

Purpose

- Update the chromium (VI) toxicity value
- Correct an error in residential soil direct contact value
- Corresponding updates to chromium (VI) soil direct contact Medium-Specific Concentrations (MSCs) under Statewide Health Standard



Background

- EPA published new toxicity values for chromium (VI) in its Integrated Risk Information System (IRIS) on August 1, 2024.
- Correction needed to add mutagenic factors into residential soil direct contact calculation that was previously not included.

MSC Value Updates – Table 4A

- Residential soil direct contact value is decreasing from 37 mg/kg to 27 mg/kg
- Nonresidential soil direct contact value is increasing from 180 mg/kg to 570 mg/kg



Affected Parties

- Any person or business who remediates chromium (VI) soil contamination using the standards established by the Land Recycling Act and the Chapter 250 regulations.
- Individuals potentially exposed to soil contaminated by chromium (VI) releases.



Environmental and Economic Impacts

- The toxicity values and associated MSCs need to reflect the best available scientific information for chromium (VI).
- The proposed changes are not expected to add any significant costs to the cleanup of contaminated sites under this rulemaking.



Advisory Committee Review

The draft proposed rule was presented to and reviewed by the Cleanup Standards Scientific Advisory Board on October 30, 2024.



Recommendation

- DEP recommends the Board adopt this proposed regulation.
- A 30-day public comment period is recommended.
