Re: Summary of Exemption from Waste Permitting Encina Development Group, LLC

Dear Ms. Houser:

Encina Development Group, LLC (Encina) is in the process of developing and permitting a facility in Point Township, Northumberland County (Facility). On June 13, 2022, representatives of Encina, ALL4 LLC (ALL4), Pennsylvania Recycling Markets Center, and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) met at the Northcentral Regional Office (NCRO) to discuss waste permitting for the proposed Facility. As follow-up to the June 13, 2022 meeting, ALL4, on behalf of Encina, is providing this letter to summarize the type and origin of materials that will be accepted at the proposed Facility.

Encina will not receive materials from "Industrial Establishments" or "Institutional Establishments", as defined in Section 102 of the Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act (SWMA). Unless otherwise noted in the materials list below, all materials received by Encina will be received from a multi re-use facility (MRF, or "murf"). The proposed Encina operations will meet the SWMA definition of an Advanced Recycling Facility.

The list of materials that will be accepted at the Facility includes:

- Polyethylene (PE) and Polypropylene (PP) plastic films
- Post-consumer olefin fines
- Low density polyethylene (LDPE) Labels in bales
- High density polyethylene (HDPE)
- HDPE mixed bales of colored/natural
- Flowerpots/trays
- MRF End of line plastics
- Mixed PP/PE regrind streams
- Plastics #1-7
- Plastics #3-7
- Rigid plastics in the form of tubs and lids
- Bulky rigid plastics (toys/trash cans)
- Expanded Polystyrene logs (may come from a MRF or a recycling consolidation program)
- Post Industrial high impact polystyrene (doors and other parts from automobiles from a recycling facility)
- Polypropylene super sacks
- Incidental metals, PVC, PET, used beverage containers, glass, paper

Encina understands that, based on the type and origin of materials described herein, the Facility qualifies as an advanced recycling facility and therefore does not require a waste permit. Should Encina desire to accept waste from industrial or institutional establishments in the future, they can apply for a GP or individual permit. Until such time as a permit would be received, materials considered residual wastes could not be accepted.
