Dear Mr. David Pannucci:

Reference is made to the permit renewal application received by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) on January 25, 2024. This application is for renewal of the operating permit for Blythe Recycling and Demolition Site (BRADS) Landfill located at 1061 Burma Road in Blythe Township, Schuylkill County.

The renewal application was deemed administratively complete on January 29, 2024. Technical review of the renewal application commenced at that time. On July 30, 2024 DEP issued a technical deficiency letter (TDL) detailing numerous concerns DEP had with the renewal application. BRADS responded to the TDL on August 29, 2024. Due to ongoing compliance issues and to further evaluate the mitigation measures implemented to address these issues, DEP extended the expiration date to July 30, 2025. Prior to this July 30, 2025 expiration date, DEP became aware of additional onsite operational issues and public concerns regarding traffic through St. Clair. For these reasons, DEP extended the permit a second time to January 30, 2026. On September 19, 2025, DEP issued a second TDL. BRADS responded to the TDL on November 10, 2025. DEP evaluated BRADS response and determined that the BRADS proposed mitigation measures should address the issues raised in the TDL, to the fullest extent possible.

DEP recognizes that BRADS has violations dating back to November 2023 that need to be addressed prior to DEP making a final decision on the renewal application. For that reason, DEP is extending BRADS permit to April 30, 2026. This will allow DEP additional time to execute a Consent Order and Agreement to address those violations and further verify that the mitigation measures implemented by BRADS are effective.

The enclosed Form 13-A provides DEP time to address the issues stated above. Except as explicitly identified in the permit conditions and the enclosed Form 13-A, no other operation or construction change has been approved.

If the terms of the permit of the conditions of this extension are not complied with, it is not guaranteed that this permit term will be extended again. Therefore, if the conditions of this extension are not complied with to the satisfaction of DEP, BRADS may have to prepare to cease all operations at the site and commence closure activities.

Any person aggrieved by this action may appeal the action to the Environmental Hearing Board (Board) pursuant to Section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act, 35 P.S. § 7514, and the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa. C.S. Chapter 5A. The Board's address is:

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of receipt of notice of this action unless the appropriate statute provides a different time. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

MODIFICATION TO SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND/OR PROCESSING PERMIT

Under the provisions of Act 97, the Solid Waste Management Act of July 7, 1980, Solid Waste Permit
Number 101679 issued on (date original permit was issued) January 20, 2015 to

is hereby modified as follows:

This permit modification is issued to allow for the short-term, continued operation of the Blythe Recycling and Demolition Site Landfill under the previously permitted terms and conditions during the pendency of the review of the ten-year renewal application, APS ID# 1106245, AUTH ID# 1470869 (“Permit Renewal”). This action is taken to provide sufficient time for the Department to complete the renewal application review process. This short-term modification of the permit shall be granted until April 30, 2026, unless this short-term modification is revoked, or a final action on the renewal application is taken sooner.

All conditions of the attached modification shall modify conditions in the original permit and subsequent modification to the original permit. Conditions contained herein that reference “permit” refer to the here-by-amended permit.

Nothing herein shall be construed to supersede, amend, or authorize violation of provisions of any valid and applicable local law, ordinance, or regulation provided that said law, ordinance, or regulation is not pre-empted by the Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act, of July 7, 1980, Act 997, 35 P.S. 60118.1010, et. seq.

1. This operating permit allows Blythe Recycling and Demolition Site Holdings, Inc. to continue to operate this facility per the existing terms and conditions of DEP Permit No. 101679 until April 30, 2026. No construction or operational changes are authorized except as explicitly identified in this permit modification.

This modification shall be attached to the existing Solid Waste Permit described above and shall become a part thereof effective on (date) January 29, 2026.
