Re: Denial of Application for Statewide General Permit Earth Revival, LLC (Earth Revival) Application Fell Township Lackawanna County

Dear Ms. Popple:

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has reviewed the application submitted by Earth Revival for the development of a new statewide general permit to authorize the processing and beneficial use of Construction and Demolition (C&D) fines mixed with Portland Cement (PC) as fill material for reclamation of pre-Act and abandoned mine lands and construction activities for completeness. This general permit application is based upon the results of the Demonstration Project conducted by Pioneer Aggregates, LLC ("Pioneer"). Pioneer submitted its final completion report (final report) on February 23, 2021, to DEP for review in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 287.504(5). Based upon, among other things, the issues identified in the Department's associated Pioneer Final Report letter, dated December 29, 2022, Pioneer did not adequately demonstrate that the use of C&D fines mixed with PC as fill material for reclamation of pre-Act and abandoned mine lands can be performed in a manner protective of public health and the environment and will not cause groundwater pollution. The proposed use of the waste material for mine reclamation cannot be considered for authorization under a Statewide General Permit, and the Department hereby denies Earth Revival's application for a Statewide General Permit.

Any person aggrieved by this action may appeal the action to the Environmental Hearing Board (Board) pursuant to Section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act, 35 P.S. § 7514, and the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa. C.S. Chapter 5A. The Board's address is:

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of receipt of notice of this action unless the appropriate statute provides a different time. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.
