



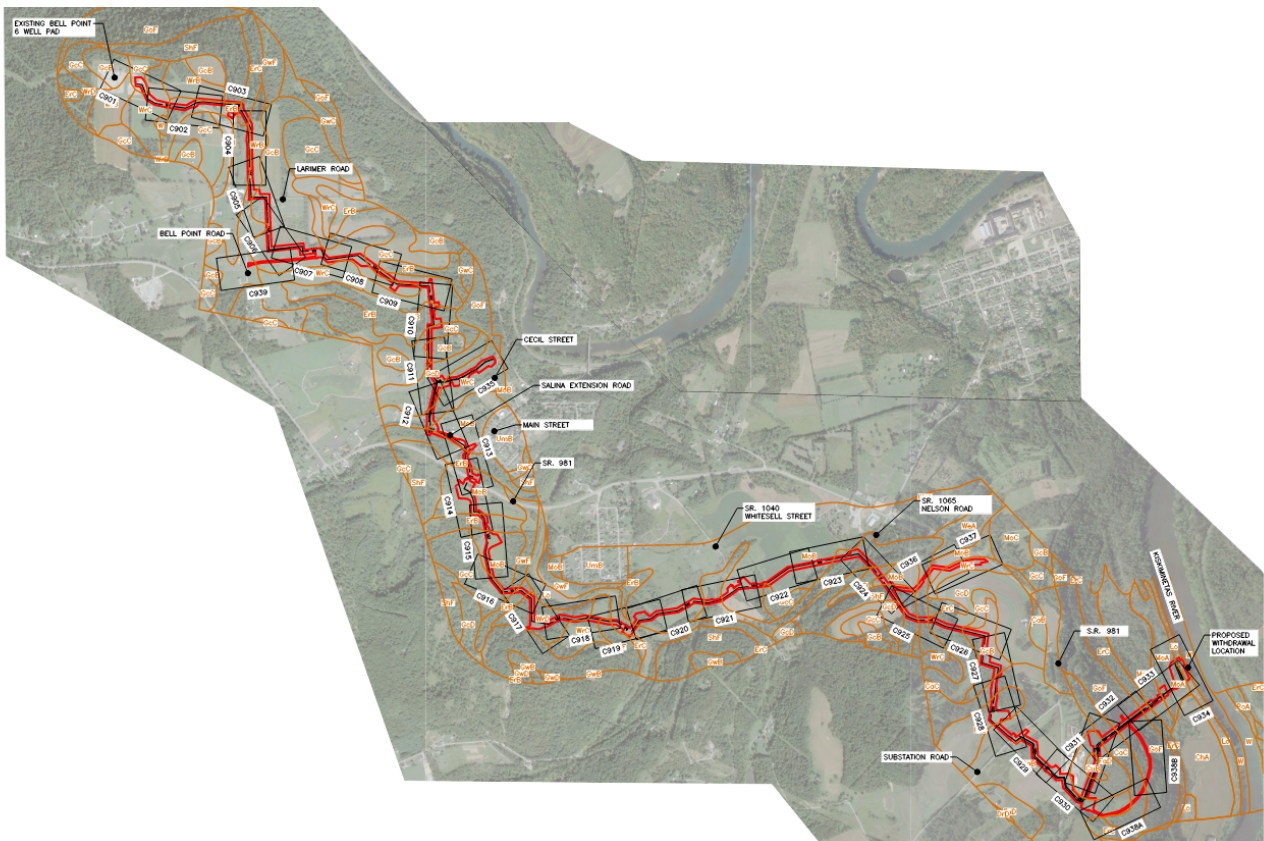

HCPP Pipeline

Homer City Generation, L.P.

Purpose of Application:

To construct approximately 5.8 miles 30-inch steel gas distribution pipeline and approximately 0.4 miles of overhead power line within a 70-125-foot wide area, temporary workspace areas to support construction, an approximate 0.9-acre permanent gravel Metering and Regulation (M&R) and Interconnect Facility with permanent gravel access roads, a 900 square foot gravel pad and access road for an electric tap, and stormwater controls.



The project would begin in Burrell Township, Indiana County approximately 1.6 miles northwest of the intersection of State Route 119 and State Route 22 at the proposed M&R and Interconnect Facility located off an existing third-party gravel access road that connects to Campbells Mill Rd (S.R. 3011). From the M&R and Interconnect Facility, a 30-inch steel gas distribution pipeline will traverse north for approximately 5.8 miles, ending at the Homer City Generating Station in Center Township. The pipeline will cross Falling Run Road (Twp 449), McConnell Road (Twp 592), Blacklick Road (S.R. 3013), Dickey Road (Twp 455), and Power Plant Road (Twp 680). The electric power tap site is located off of Country Lane Road (Twp 442). From the electric power tap, an overhead electric line will extend north approximately 0.4 mile ending at the M&R and Interconnect Facility. The pipeline would include 9 utility line crossings (GP-5) and 11 temporary road crossings (GP 8) of streams, floodways, and wetlands authorized by separate DEP Permits, which can be reviewed on DEP's website.

May 5, 2026

A *draft* NPDES Permit was published in the Pa. Bulletin for a 30-day comment period on February 7, 2026. The comment period closed on March 9, 2026. During this time DEP received public comments on the permit application and requests for a public hearing.

At a public hearing DEP accepts oral testimony from citizens on the application for consideration in making a final permit decision. All oral testimony provided has equal weight to those comments submitted to DEP in writing. Testimony must be received in writing or in person by the close of the public hearing.

What happens next?

DEP will review all public comments and if comments have merit on the adequacy of the *draft* Permit, DEP may request additional information from the applicant for further consideration. During the review of the comments and any additional information, DEP will determine if the final project proposal meets applicable statutory and regulatory requirements. DEP's determination will either result in issuance of a final NPDES Permit or denial of the permit application.

DEP will also prepare a Comment Response Document with a statement of the final permit decision that will be available to the public.
