The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is seeking information concerning a release and/or threat of release of hazardous substances into the environment from the Bishop Tube Site (Site) in East Whiteland Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania. The site is located on Malin Road just south of U.S. Route 30, Frazer, PA.

The Department's records indicate that Johnson-Matthey, Inc. is a successor company of Bishop Tube Company, which formerly owned and operated the Bishop Tube Site. If so, you may have information relevant to the release of hazardous substances at the site. Therefore, pursuant to Section 503 of the Pennsylvania Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA), the Act 108 of October 18, 1988, 35 P.S. Section 6020.503, the Department requests that you furnish all the information and documents in your possession, custody or control, or in the possession, custody or control of the officers, employees or agents of Johnson-Matthey, Inc., which concern, refer to or relate to hazardous substances, as that term is defined by Section 103 of HSCA, 35 P.S. Section 6020.103, which were generated, treated, stored, disposed, transported to, or released at the Site.
