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**Narrative (continued):**

Observations:

- The interface probe was properly decontaminated between each use
- PID readings were obtained immediately when the well cap was opened.
- Product samples were collected from the well at [REDACTED]
- The homeowner at [REDACTED] came outside to observe activities.

[REDACTED]: Light odors noticed while the well head was open. The smell was not constant during activities but was sensed in wafts.

[REDACTED]: Light odors noticed immediately when the well head was open, which resolved after a few seconds.

When I arrived onsite a crew from GES was there performing pumping of the recovery well network (RW-2 through RW-4). When RW-2 was opened I did not smell any odors.

I spoke with Kevin from GES who was onsite screening the recovery well network on Glenwood Drive with a PID. No elevated PID readings were observed during his screening.

I spoke further with Kevin and the other GES crew about complaints of odors after hours when there is no work being completed or personnel in the neighborhood. The GES crew explained that the well caps for all recovery wells are always screwed back on tightly after pumping activities are completed for the day for each well. I inquired about any possible spills or drips that could have occurred in the last few days and they told me there were no spills or drippage. They also explained that in the event of minimal drippage occurring during activities, they keep absorbent pads around the open well and mop up the area when they are finished. I did not notice any odors along the recovery network, or any staining or sheens indicative of petroleum.

I spoke with [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] after observing gauging and bailing activities. I arrived at [REDACTED] home at 11:15. [REDACTED] had complaints of odors around RW-2 in the evening of 6/17/25 after work was completed for the day. [REDACTED] explained that around 5:45pm [REDACTED] was walking the neighborhood and got a waft of petroleum smell while [REDACTED] as standing very close to RW-2. [REDACTED] explained that [REDACTED] stood there for a few moments and continued to get wafts of the same odor before continuing [REDACTED] walk. There was no other activity going on during this time, including yard work or larger vehicles, etc. [REDACTED] noted that another neighbor complained of the same odor in the same location around 8pm that same night. [REDACTED] also noted that another resident was on a morning walk this morning, 6/18/25 and complained of an overwhelming petroleum odor around [REDACTED], the home purchased by the Company and the site of recovery well RW-1. I documented our conversation and left the residence.

I departed from the neighborhood at 11:32.

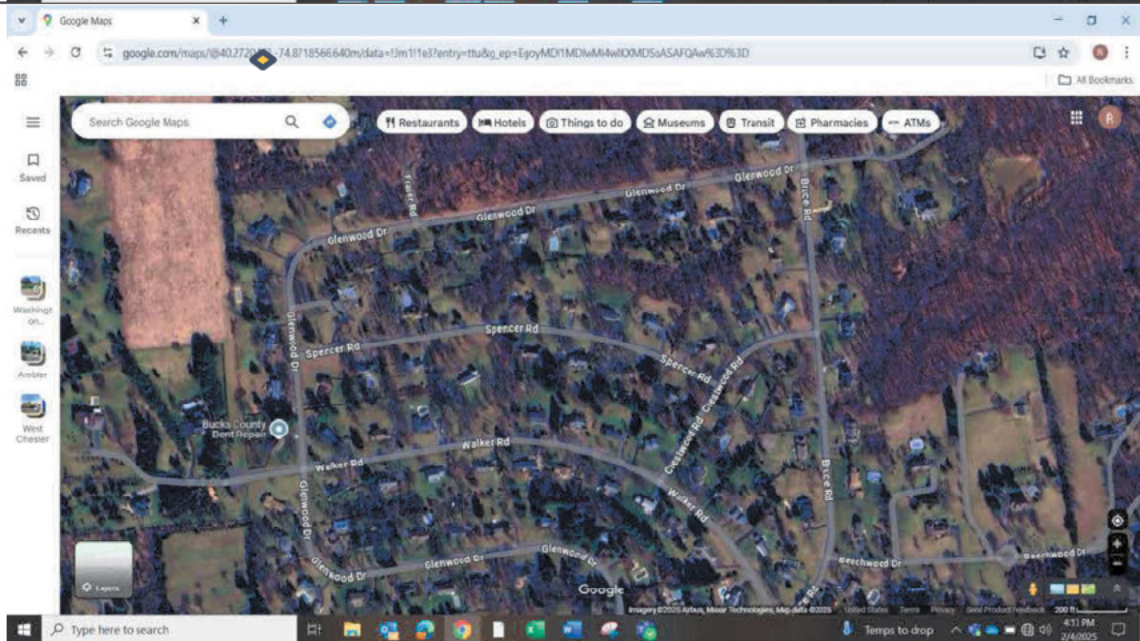
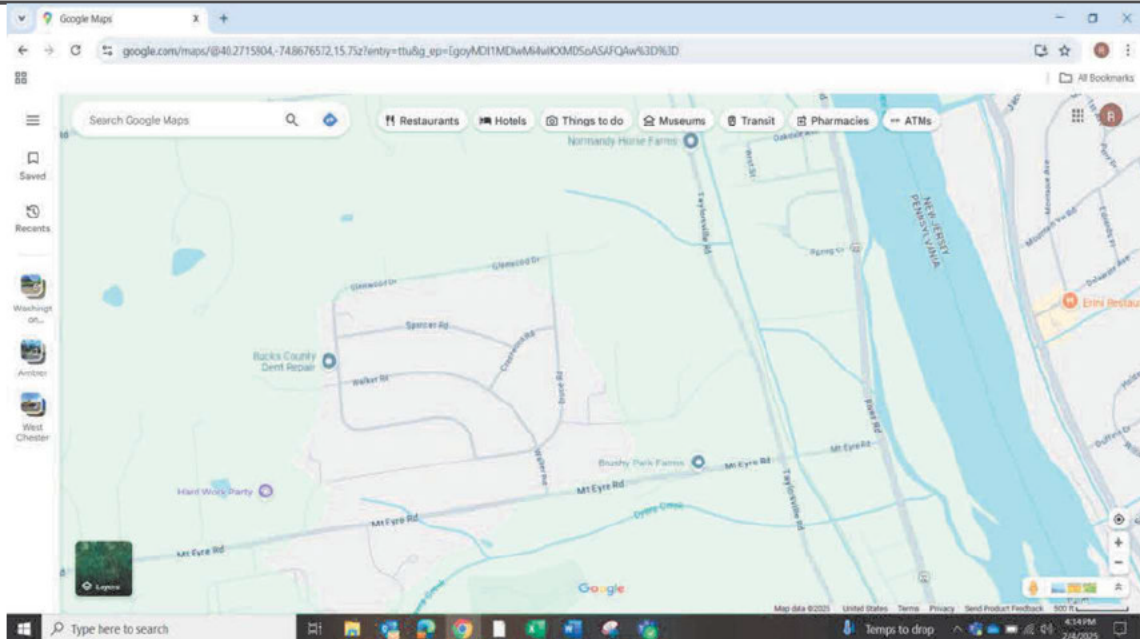
