Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting the renewal of an NPDES permit for a single residence sewage treatment plant (SRSTP) for a discharge of up to 0.0004 MGD of treated sewage into Niche Pond (Unnamed Tributary to Raymondskill Creek), a High Quality, Cold-Water Fishery, Migratory Fish (HQ – CWF, MF) receiving stream in State Water Plan watershed 1-D (Shohola – Bushkill Creeks).

As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than the designated use. This stream segment is not designated as a naturally reproducing trout stream as per PA Fish & Boat Commission. This discharge is not expected to affect public water supplies.

All limits and monitoring frequencies have been carried over from the previous permit.

A note has been added under the Part A effluent limitation table requiring at least one sample for Fecal Coliform to be taken between June 1 and August 31 each year.

The Annual Maintenance Report (AMR) that's to be issued with the final permit shall be used to record the monitoring results. Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) will not be sent with the final permit.

The existing permit expired on April 30, 2020 and the application for renewal was received late on December 17, 2021. The application was also received incomplete.

A Water Management System Inspection query indicated that a Compliance Evaluation was performed on October 28, 2021.

Summary of Review

There are currently seven open violations for this client that may need to be resolved before issuance of the final permit:

1. 10/28/2021 - Violation ID 935199 – Violation Code 92A.75(A) – NPDES-Failure to submit NPDES renewal application at least 180 days prior to expiration or later approved date.

2. 10/28/2021 - Violation ID 935200 – Violation Code 92A.1(B) – NPDES-Discharge of pollutants from a point source into surface waters without an NPDES permit.

3. 10/28/2021 - Violation ID 935201 – Violation Code 92A.41(A)12B – NPDES-Failure to submit monitoring report(s) or properly complete monitoring reports.

4. 10/28/2021 - Violation ID 935202 – Violation Code 92A.46 – NPDES-Violation of Part C permit condition(s).

5. 12/03/2021 – Violation ID 938062 – Violation Code 92A.75(A) – NPDES-Failure to submit NPDES renewal application at least 180 days prior to expiration or later approved date.

6. 12/03/2021 - Violation ID 938063 – Violation Code 92A.1(B) – NPDES-Discharge of pollutants from a point source into surface waters without an NPDES permit.

7. 12/03/2021 - Violation ID 93064 – Violation Code 92A.41(A)12B – NPDES-Failure to submit monitoring report(s) or properly complete monitoring reports.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
