Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting renewal of an NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with an industrial activity to Bushkill Creek, a high quality, cold water fishery, migratory fishery-designated receiving stream (HQ-CWF, MF) in State Water Plan Basin 01-F. Per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than the designated use. The discharge is not expected to affect public water supplies.

The facility is classified under SIC Code 3471 – Manufacturing – Plating and Polishing. The PAG-03 General Permit Appendix U contains the site-specific best management practices (BMPs) and monitoring requirements for this industrial stormwater classification. The monitoring requirements are for pH (S.U.), Total Suspended Solids, Nitrate-Nitrite as N, Total Aluminum, Total Iron, and Total Zinc. All applicable parameters are to be sampled once every six (6) months. The General Stormwater Permit is the minimum standard for all Individual Stormwater permits based on SIC code.

Monitoring and reporting requirements for Total Kjedahl Nitrogen (TKN) are removed from the permit as per updated requirements under Appendix U. Monitoring and reporting requirements for Total Recoverable Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TRPH) are also removed from the permit; the requirement was added to the last permit in response to a spill of transformer oil in 2012.

The requirements will also include prohibition of non-stormwater discharges; Hazardous Substances Release; a PPC Plan; Comprehensive Site Compliance Inspection; record keeping and limit values for Total Suspended Solids (TSS).

The existing monitoring requirements will be updated according to Appendix U for parameters and frequency accordingly.

The WMS Report Query "Water Management System Inspections" was performed. A Compliance Evaluation was done on April 25, 2019, and no violations were noted.

Summary of Review

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
