

Description:

Bortnick Dairy LLC has submitted an application for the renewal of their CAFO permit for their existing dairy operation located in Crawford County. The operation has a total of 2,965 AEUs with an animal density of .99 AEU/A at the Home Farm, 220 AEUs with an animal density of .9 AEU/A at the Beary Farm, and 197 AEUs with an animal density of .95 AEU/A at the Cochranton Farm. Since the operation has more than 2 AEU/A, it is considered a CAFO. Since the operation is a CAFO with more than 300 AEUs, it exceeds the EPA threshold of 700 mature dairy cows. and it is an operation with more than 1.000 AEUs, it is considered a CAFO.

The nearest potential receiving stream is Stone Run, designated for Cold Water Fish. This stream is identified to be impaired by Organic Enrichment.

Manure/Nutrient Management:

The NMP was approved on September 9, 2022. There are 1,251.72 acres available on lands owned by the applicant and 2,042.48 acres rented for manure application according to the NMP.

The following requirements must be met when transferring manure to other persons:

40 CFR 122.42(e)(3) - Requirements relating to transfer of manure or process wastewater to other persons.

Prior to transferring manure, litter, or process wastewater to other persons, Large CAFOs must provide the recipient of the manure, litter or process wastewater with the most current nutrient analysis. The analysis provided must be consistent with the requirements of 40 CFR part 412. Large CAFOs must retain for five years records of the date, recipient name and address, and approximate amount of manure, litter or process wastewater transferred to another person.

Winter Manure Management:

Application of manure during the winter period is not approved in the NMP.

Manure Storage Facilities:

Home Farm: Pit #1 open manure storage ~ 3.1 million gallons Pit #2 open manure storage ~ 6.4 million gallons

Martin Farm: open in ground manure storage pit ~ 2 million gallons

Dad's Pit: ~6 million gallons

Animal Mortality:

All animal moralities will be transported to LDMorrison Trucking LLC, 3219 McMackin Road, Madison, OH 44057, where there is a large composting facility. All solid manure and waste feed are used to facilitate the composting process. After the composting process, all the compost and solid manure will be land applied.

Animal Concentration Areas (Chapter 102.4a):

The operation does not have Animal Heavy Use Areas (AHUAs).

Chapter 102 E&S (Conservation Plans):

Agricultural E&S Plans have been included and verified to exist for land subjected to plowing and tilling activities.

Downstream Public Water Supplies:

The nearest downstream public water intake is approx. 53.38 miles to the international water of Lake Erie. This facility is not expected to adversely impact any public water supplies.

Public Participation:

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
