

## SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE RESOURCES FOR SOUTHWESTERN PENNSYLVANIA

Small businesses in Pennsylvania may have concerns about impacts on their business operation relating to the February 3, 2023, train derailment in East Palestine, Ohio. This handout and the DEP website (scan DEP QR code below) provide information available from several local, state, and federal agencies or organizations that have resources to keep businesses informed of potential impacts and to enable businesses to operate more efficiently to offset any potential losses resulting from the event.

- The PA Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) continues to provide updates on the East Palestine train derailment, including air, water, and soil sampling results.
- Small Business Ombudsman Office grant and loan programs (SBAG and PPAA) to improve energy efficiency and reduce pollution; confidential assistance to small businesses (industrial, agricultural, etc.) for any issues related to PA DEP. RAepombudsman@pa.gov

- The PA Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) helps communities and citizens mitigate against, prepare for, respond to, and recover from emergencies including natural disasters, acts of terrorism, or other human-made disasters.

- The PA Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Programs and Funding webpage can be searched by entity type (businesses) and by funding type (grant, loan, etc.)
- PA Industrial Development Authority (PIDA) low-interest loans and lines of credit for eligible businesses that commit to create and retain full-time jobs and develop industrial parks and multi-tenant facilities.
- Industrial Sites Reuse Program (ISRP) grant and low-interest loan financing to perform environmental site assessment and remediation work at former industrial sites.





- The PA Office of Small Business Advocate (OSBA) is an independent state agency, administratively situated within DCED.
- OSBA is responsible for representing and protecting the legal rights and interests of Pennsylvania's small business utility consumers (employing from one to 250 employees) in all legal matters before the Public Utility Commission (PUC), corresponding state and federal regulatory agencies, and in higher courts.

- The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has been onsite since the onset of the train derailment, supporting local and state partners.
- Links are provided for EPA's Emergency Response page, its About Air Monitoring page, and to two new funding programs focusing on pollution prevention from businesses in areas impacted by environmental justice concerns.





- The US Small Business Administration (SBA) provides services including funding programs, counseling, federal contracting certifications, and disaster recovery.
- Links included are SBA funding opportunities, SCORE – Pittsburgh (business counseling), the Center for Women's Entrepreneurship, and the Veterans Outreach Business Center.





- PA Small Business Development Centers (SBDCs) – consultants work with entrepreneurs in confidential, one-on-one sessions to help them with business issues including testing a new business proposition, shaping a business plan, investigating funding opportunities, and much more.
- There are 15 SBDCs spread throughout the Commonwealth.
