What is Greenport?


- The electronic portal to PA DEP
- Create a <u>single</u> account for yourself
 - Your single account can be used to enroll in different DEP programs.
 - You can link to individual clients by becoming an "EFA" or a preparer for that client.
 - Provides a dashboard for all your permits and tasks.

What can be done through epermitting


- Bituminous surface mining permits (new and pre-applications)
- Notice of Intent to explore (Coal)
- Hydrologic Monitoring Reports (all)
- Annual Production Reports (all)

Important details about e-permitting

- Register for EFA online
- Different EFA process from eDMR
- Be patient waiting for the screens to fully load



How to Register for an account on Greenport

To create your Greenport account, select the "Register" button on the right.

After you register, use the Login space on the left.

What is an EFA – Electronic File Administrator?

- Has the rights to submit for the client/company.
- Has rights to approve submittals by "preparers".
- Must approve anyone registered as a "preparer" for the company.
- Each company should have at least one EFA but at least one backup is recommended.
- Companies must keep track of EFAs.

If an EFA is no longer with the company, the company must notify DEP to remove the EFA. Another person must be assigned.

What is a Preparer?

- Can prepare reports and permits but cannot officially submit.
- Must be approved by the EFA to prepare submittals for the company.
- Work submitted must be approved by EFA.
- Appropriate for a consultant where the EFA gives final approval.
- Preparers do not need to fill out a form but request access through Greenport which goes to the EFA.

Can a consultant be an EFA?

- A consultant must attest that they take the responsibility for the company submittals.
- The company must attest in writing that they approve the individual consultant by name to be an authorized representative (EFA) for the company.

Warning: If an EFA is no longer employed or contracted by the company, the company must notify DEP to remove the EFA. Another person must be assigned. Otherwise, the EFA will still have access.

Because the consultant enrollment is slightly different than for a company employee, this process is outlined later in this presentation.


How to set up e-permitting

- 1. EFA for the company enrolls in the Bureau of Mining Program through Greenport.
- 2. EFA gets notice of approval and can begin.


Items to have before starting EFA process:

- Names and addresses of company
- EIN or License Number of Mine Operator
- If you are a consultant acting on behalf of a person or mining company, a letter by a company officer or owner giving permission for you (by name) to act as the EFA. Scan into a PDF.

On your Greenport dashboard page, scroll down to the Request Access button



On the next screen, select Enroll next to e-permitting.



You are then on the epermitting Home page. If you have enrolled in other programs, they will appear here. If you need to enroll as an EFA for a mining facility, choose the Enrollment Dashboard button



If you serve multiple mining companies (different mining licenses), you must complete these steps for each one individually.

If your facility has multiple program areas (air, water use reporting), you must enroll in each program individually.

You are now on the self-enrollment dashboard page.


This shows all your pending enrollments.



For this field, put in your mining permit number.





Here is where you need the PDF letter of permission from company.


Click the Upload button

Review and submit.


You can now begin work on applications or reports while the EFA approval is under review.


ePermitting on Greenport

Now epermitting will appear as an option in your Greenport dashboard




ePermitting on Greenport
