
Why: A Broad Perspective

- Chesapeake Bay clean-up
- CBRAP
- Scale
 - -Statewide: 63,000+ farms
 - -South-central region: 20,000 + farms
 - –DEP SCRO CBRAP Goals225 ag inspections/year
- Need for a fresh approach

Why the Kish watershed?

- Extensive outreach and education by the CD over past decade
- 319 WIP completed and approved
- Poor compliance rates
 - Lack of Conservation Plans
 - Lack of Manure Management Plans
 - Lack of appropriate BMPs, both in field and for ACA/AHUAs



Compliance Timeframes

- If no plans and on the ground WQ problems exist, operator has 90 days to obtain plans
- If no plan within 90 days, DEP will issue a Field Order
 - Field Order will provide 90 more days to obtain plans
- If no plans after 180 days, penalties will be assessed



Benefits of this approach

- More efficient use of staff time
- Less initial paperwork
- Allows adequate time for operator to obtain plans
- Focus is on real, on the ground environmental problems











Initial Inspections

- Inspections complete at 19 "working" farms of 10+ acres during September and October 2012.
- 2 of 19 farms had plans available for review
- 13 of 19 farms did not have notable water quality concerns
- 6 of 19 farms received inspection reports requesting the development of the required plans within 90 days.



Follow-up visits after 90 days

- Follow-up inspections conducted at 6 farms during January and February 2013.
- 4 farms were found to be in compliance with the regulations/the Departments request to obtain the required plans.
- 2 farms were found to be in continued violation—with no apparent attempts made to initiate planning.



Current Status of the initiative

The 2 farms determined to be in continuing violation during the follow-up inspection were issued Field Orders requiring:

- Development and submission of Ag E&S plan and Manure
 Management Plan within 90 days (4/30/2013)
- Plan Implementation schedule requiring installation of BMPS to address identified resource concerns by 10/15/13 all other BMPs within 3 yrs of plan development.
