<p>Water Quality Standards—Class A Stream Redesignations (#7-583) 25 Pa. Code Chapter 93 <i>Section 303(c)(1) of the Federal Clean Water Act</i></p> <p>This rulemaking includes revisions that are the result of stream evaluations conducted by DEP in response to a submittal of data from the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC). Redesignations rely on § 93.4b(a)(2)(ii) to qualify streams for High Quality (HQ) designations based upon their classifications as Class A wild trout streams. DEP staff conducted an independent review of the trout biomass data in the PFBC's fisheries management reports for streams throughout the Commonwealth to ensure that the HQ criteria were met. <p>Administration of the Land Recycling Program (#7-575) 25 Pa. Code Chapter 250 <i>Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act</i></p> <p>The rulemaking proposes to amend Chapter 250 to update the medium specific concentrations (MSC) established under the Statewide health standard based on the most recent published scientific information. MSCs are concentrations of contaminants in soil and groundwater that are protective of human health and the environment under various exposure scenarios. This rulemaking will focus on updates to the models used to calculate the MSCs for lead in soil and potential changes to how the MSCs for carcinogenic polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAH) are calculated. These regulations identify the formulas DEP must use to calculate MSCs and the sources of the toxicological information. This rulemaking also proposes to clarify administrative elements of Chapter 250.
