Thank you for submitting information concerning the above referenced project. The Pennsylvania State Historic Preservation Office (PA SHPO) reviews projects in accordance with state and federal laws. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, and the implementing regulations (36 CFR Part 800) of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, is the primary federal legislation. The Environmental Rights amendment, Article 1, Section 27 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and the Pennsylvania History Code, 37 Pa. Cons. Stat. Section 500 et seq. (1988) is the primary state legislation. These laws include consideration of the project's potential effects on both historic and archaeological resources.

The proposed project is located in a largely agricultural landscape and one previously identified National Register eligible farm, the Gillis Doty Farm, is within the Area of Potential Effect. Based on an examination of the current and historic aerials and plans provided, it does not appear that historic landscape features such as woodlots, hedgerows, and stone walls will be affected by the proposed pipeline construction. Please indicate if any above ground features such as pipe yards, compressor stations, or wastewater ponds will be introduced by the project. Please also indicate if the agricultural landscape will be restored to current conditions following construction of the pipeline. We will use this information to assess the potential for effects. Based on an evaluation by our staff, there is a high probability that National Register-eligible archaeological sites are present within this project area. These sites could be adversely affected by project activities. Our review considers the locations of known archaeological resources, the Statewide Pre-Contact Predictive Model, soil type, topographic setting, slope direction and distance to water, among other regionally specific predictive factors for archaeological site locations. It is our opinion that a Phase I


archaeological survey should be conducted to locate potentially significant resources. Guidelines and instructions for conducting all phases of archaeological survey in Pennsylvania are available on our website.
