

Chapter 102 Regulations Relative to "Application for an Onlot Sewage Disposal System Permit."

Section 102.43 of the Chapter 102 Erosion and Sediment Control regulations requires that when more than one acre of a property will be disturbed, a permit for earth disturbance activities be obtained before other local permits or approvals for the site are issued. As requested by the Sewage Advisory Committee (SAC), the department has amended the *Application for an Onlot Sewage Disposal System Permit* (Form 3800-FM-BPNPSM290) to include the following two check boxes addressing this requirement. The reverse side of the form includes brief instructions for completion of the checkboxes.

- Permit or coverage under Chapter 102 Erosion and Sedimentation Control required
- Permit or coverage under Chapter 102 Erosion and Sedimentation Control obtained

When a proposed development requires an individual Chapter 102 permit or coverage under a Chapter 102 general permit, the applicant is responsible for marking these checkboxes on the onlot system permit application prior to submitting the application to the SEO. Applicants who do not know if Chapter 102 applies to their project should contact the local Conservation District or the DEP Regional Office.

When reviewing an onlot system permit application, the SEO should review these new checkboxes to determine if the application is complete. If the first checkbox is completed (Chapter 102 applies to the proposed development), then the applicant must also check the second checkbox indicating that the permit or coverage required under Chapter 102 has been obtained for the application to be considered complete. The SEO bears no further responsibility with regard to the Chapter 102 requirements. Supporting documentation is not required by the department, but may be required by the local agency.
