Ultraviolet disinfection on shallow limiting zones

Retraction of August 1, 2011 Memo

Effective immediately, the Department retracts the August 1, 2011 memorandum relative to the requirements of ultraviolet disinfection (UV) as a component of onlot septic systems on shallow limiting zones. This retraction applies to the Perc Rite systems manufactured by American Manufacturing and the GSF System manufactured by Eljen Corp., among others. A shallow limiting zone in the context of onlot sewage disposal is defined as less than 20 inches from the mineral surface. Therefore, systems classified as onlot alternate technologies may be sited on soils with a limiting zone of less than 20 inches without the requirement for UV disinfection.

For current onlot alternate technology siting requirements, please refer to individual classification listings either in the Alternate Systems Guidance document or in the Onlot Alternate Technology Listings section posted on DEP's website as they will note any disinfection requirements specific to each technology.

In the future, the Department may revisit siting and disinfection requirements for sewage disposal on shallow soil settings. However, until such time, please refer to the current classification listings.
