#### Fees – Background

 Fees are necessary to generate adequate funding to carry out <u>minimum program elements</u>.

- Conducting sanitary surveys of public water supply systems
- Data systems: Tracking monitoring and compliance; and maintaining an inventory of public water systems
- Assuring the availability of certified laboratories for drinking water analysis
- Permit review and approval
- Taking actions necessary and appropriate for enforcement of drinking water standards.



#### Fees – Background

- Fees are necessary to generate adequate funding to carry out minimum program elements.
- Failure to meet minimum program elements may result in an increased risk to public health.
- Program performance is currently under review by EPA. As per EPA, the Department's workload is excessive and not sustainable.

#### New SDW Fees

Applies to ALL public water systems.

A public drinking water system, as defined in Chapter 109.1, is a system which provides water to the public for human consumption which has at **least 15 service connections or** regularly serves an average of at least 25 individuals daily at **least 60 days out of the year**. The term includes collection, treatment, storage and distribution facilities under control of the operator of the system and used in connection with the system. The term includes collection or pretreatment storage facilities not under control of the operator which are used in connection with the system. The term also includes a system which provides water for bottling or bulk hauling for human consumption. Water for human consumption includes water that is used for drinking, bathing and showering, cooking, dishwashing or maintaining oral hygiene.


#### Welcome | Selection Criteria | Contact Us \*

Welcome to the Drinking Water Reporting System (DWRS). The DWRS allows public access to public drinking water systems' sample history, inventory information and recent violation history. Based on selection criteria provided by the user, information will be displayed for a single water system or multiple systems. For instructions on how to use DWRS click here.

- Monitoring Requirements are updated in February of each year to reflect changes caused by end of year monitoring compliance determination.
- An information request for "Sample History" includes all sample results submitted to Pennsylvania's Safe Drinking Water program within the last five years.
- An information request for "Summarized Sample Results" provides one or more of the following data sets:
  - o Turbidity Summary Data
  - Total Coliform and Disinfectant Residual Summary Data
  - Lead and Copper 90th Percentile Value and Summary Data
  - o Total Organic Carbon (TOC) Report
- Information on "Detailed Sample Results" is available by selecting one of the contaminant groups (SOC, IOC, VOC, etc) and/or individual
  contaminants.
- An information request for "Inventory Information" includes source, entry point, treatment plant and contact information as well as a system's

#### CHAPTER 109 - SAFE DRINKING WATER ANNUAL FEE

Subchapter N of the PA Safe Drinking Water Regulations (Title 25 Pa. Code Chapter 109) requires public water systems (PWS) to pay an annual fee to the Department based on the PWS population. This annual fee is separate from, and in addition to, the Chapter 302 annual service fee that public water systems are also required to pay for the administration of the Operator Certification Program. Failure to submit the fee by the specified deadline will result in 6% interest being assessed on the entire annual fee amount.



#### Payments


- Failure to submit payment

  - May lead to suspension of technical services
