Agriculturally Impaired Stream Restoration 2016 Growing Greener Grant - Grant No. <u>4100080507</u> Sponsor: Northcentral Pennsylvania Conservancy

Project Description

Working together the partnership made up of the Northcentral Pennsylvania Conservancy, Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, various County Conservation Districts, and DEP worked to stabilize eroding streambanks and eliminate the source of sedimentation and impairment. The partners installed instream structures such as mudsills, single log vanes, and toe logs, and also created crossings and walkways, installed fencing, and planted vegetative stabilization.

Project Goals

Decrease streambank erosion and stabilize streambanks and riparian areas.

Project Results

Work was done at 24 sites. Nearly 25,000 feet of stream were impacted with fencing, crossings, buffer plantings and instream habitat structures (to stabilize the streambank and decrease erosion).

Project Costs

\$354,972.00 of Growing Greener Grant Funds were spent and matched with over \$250,000.00 in match.

Lessons Learned

Building trust with the landowners is critical.
