Project Title: Spring Creek Watershed Initiative- Stream and Riparian Restoration

Project Description:

Spring Creek, although an impaired stream, is a world class trout fishery located in central Pennsylvania and a major tributary of the West Branch of the Susquehanna River. This project continues a watershed wide effort to improve the quality of the habitat while reducing downstream sediment at three locations using in-stream structures and riparian buffer planting. The design and execution was performed by PA Fish and Boat Commission at 2 sites and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at the third in late summer of 2022.

Project Goals:

- 1. Improve stream habitat
- 2. Decrease sediment and silt in-stream
- 3. Reconnect to the flood plain.

Project Results:

- 1. Significant habitat improvement at all three sites.
- 2. Reduction of pollutants:
