PA-AWWA and PADEP would like to recognize the staff of the Schuylkill County Municipal Authority - Mountain Laurel Filter Plant (SCMA) for their efforts in working on the Phase III Self-Assessment. While SCMA has not yet completed their Phase III report, they have been using the adequate report example, found on the PfSW website (http://www.awwa.org/Science/partnership/infocenter/SampleReports as a template for their own report. To date they've answered questions in the majority of self-assessment sections. With Pat Caulfield leading the effort, SCMA staff have been working together to identify performance limiting factors and develop action plans to address these factors. These efforts help to further improve overall plant performance and optimize finished water quality for customers. According to Mr. Caulfield, SCMA plans to finish up some remaining questions, organize report attachments, and hope to have the Phase III report completed by the end of March!

## **Water/Wastewater Operator Certification Examination**

he Pennsylvania Section of the American Water Works Association (PA-AWWA) and Water Works Operators of Pennsylvania (WWOAP) are partnering with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to present the NEW Operators Certification Examination. To reach the ultimate goal of increased drinking water and wastewater system compliance with the requirement to have a qualified certified operator, DEP requires testing in order to obtain a license to operate a water plant in Pennsylvania.
