### \*\*EMERGENCY OVERVIEW\*\*

Irritating to eyes and skin. Contains ethylene glycol monobutyl ether (butoxyethanol), Prolonged and/or repeated exposure through inhalation or extensive skin contact with EGBE may result in damage to the blood and kidneys. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Do not take internally. Use with adequate ventilation. In case of contact with eyes, rinse immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice. After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water. Use a mild soap if available.

#### EYE CONTACT:

Can cause moderate to severe irritation.

#### INGESTION

# 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### EYE CONTACT:

### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

#### PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS:

Restrict access to area as appropriate until clean-up operations are complete. Use personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 (Exposure Controls/Personal Protection). Stop or reduce any leaks if it is safe to do so. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Ventilate spill area if possible. Ensure clean-up is conducted by trained personnel only. Do not touch spilled material. Have emergency equipment (for fires, spills, leaks, etc.) readily available.

#### METHODS FOR CLEANING UP:

#### **ENGINEERING MEASURES:**
