Purpose of Application Renewal of NPDES permit to discharge industrial wastewater and stormwater.					

## **Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting a renewal of their NPDES permit to discharge vehicle rinse water via oil water separator and stormwater associated with industrial activity to an Unnamed Tributary to Nine Partners Creek, a CWF, MF (Cold-Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in State Water Plan Basin 4-F (Tunkhannock Creek). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 5541 (Retail Trade – Gasoline Service Stations) and falls under Appendix L monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit for the stormwater discharges.

Appendix L of the latest statewide PAG-03 General Permit includes benchmark values for Total Suspended Solids (TSS) and Oil and Grease. Limitations for Oil & Grease are already present in the existing permit and have been carried over to the new permit. BPJ limitations of 30.0 mg/L average quarterly and 60.0 mg/L IMAX for TSS have been added to the permit due to both stormwater and industrial waste being present in the same outfall.

PENTOX modeling was performed using the sample results provided by the applicant's consultant. There are no representative stream gages in the vicinity of the outfall, so the state-wide default low flow yield (LFY) of 0.1 cfs/mi² was used to model the discharge. RMI values were obtained using the Department's eMapPA, drainage areas were delineated using USGS's StreamStats interactive map, and elevations were obtained using the elevation profile tool on StreamStats. PENTOX modeling and the Toxic Screening Analysis Spreadsheet recommended adding a monitor only parameter for Total Cadmium and Total Dissolved Solids (TDS). A quarterly sampling frequency was used to remain consist with other reporting requirements for this facility.

PPC plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

There is currently one open violation for this client that may need to be resolved before issuance of the final permit:

1. 07/01/2019 - Violation ID 854389 - Violation Code: 245.305 - Failure to properly report a release (Program Specific ID: 58-38205).

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
