**Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting a renewal of their NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to an Unnamed Tributary to Monocacy Creek, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 2-C (Lower Lehigh River). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

The previous permit listed the facility as located in Bethlehem City, however the facility is actually located in Hanover Township. This has been corrected for this permit renewal.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 4213 (Transportation & Utilities – Trucking, Except Local) and falls under Appendix L monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit.

Appendix L of the latest PAG-03 General Permit includes benchmark values for Total Suspended Solids (TSS) and Oil & Grease. All industries classified under Appendix L should be within the following values: 100 mg/L for TSS and 30 mg/L for Oil & Grease. These values are included as IMAX limitations and should be sampled semi-annually. Semi-annual monitoring and reporting for pH is also required under this permit. Monitoring and reporting requirements for Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen and Total Iron are removed from the permit as per updated requirements under Appendix L.

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

A Water Management System Inspection query was performed and indicated on January 24, 2019 a Compliance Evaluation was performed.

The previously issued permit expired on April 30, 2019 and the renewal application was received late on November 6, 2018.

### Summary of Review

There are currently four open violations in the storage tank program for this client that may need to be resolved before issuance of the final permit:

- 1-3. 07/20/2018 - Violation ID 829531 through 829533 – Inspection ID 2783210 – Failure to comply with underground storage tank system release detection requirements (Inspection Program: Storage Tanks, Program Specific ID: 22-64678, South Central Regional Office).
4. 10/31/2018 - Violation ID 833745– Inspection ID 2804439 – Failure to comply with underground storage tank system release detection requirements (Inspection Program: Storage Tanks, Program Specific ID: 22-64678, South Central Regional Office).

### Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
