Purpose of Application Renewal of existing NPDES permit for discharge of industrial stormwater.				

Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting renewal of an existing NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to an Unnamed Tributary to Tunkhannock Creek, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 2-A (Upper Lehigh River). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream segment does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

This FedEx facility is a less than truckload freight terminal and all freight is loaded/unloaded inside the indoor dock. Diesel fueling of trucks from the underground storage tanks occurs inside the fuel bay. Vehicle washing is performed by a vendor that contains, collects, and removes was water for proper disposal off-site. Vehicle maintenance is performed inside the shop is not exposed to stormwater. Stormwater from the site is directed to an on-site detention pond located at the west side of the property.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 4213 (Transportation & Utilities – Trucking – Except Local) and falls under Appendix L monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit. Semi-annual monitoring and reporting for Total Suspended Solids (TSS) and Oil & Grease are required under the PAG-03. Monitoring and reporting requirements for Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen, Total Iron, and pH have been removed from the permit as per updated requirements under Appendix L.

Benchmark values exist for TSS and Oil & Grease. A benchmark value is the concentration of a pollutant in stormwater discharges that serves as a threshold for the determination of whether existing site BMPs are effective in controlling stormwater pollution. The benchmark values can be found in Part C. V. F. of the permit. A corrective action plan must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceed the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

Summary of Review

The previously issued permit expired on January 31, 2021 and the renewal application was received late on December 10, 2020. Processing of this renewal application was delayed due to stormwater sample results not being submitted for the parameters listed on the renewal application. The completed sample results were received by the Department on June 22, 2021.

A Water Management System Inspection query indicates a Compliance Evaluation was performed on October 3, 2018.

There are currently no open violations for this client that would warrant withholding the issuance of this permit.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
