Purpose of Application	<u>Renewal of NPDES Individual Stormwater Permit.</u>		

Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting the renewal of an NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to Iron Run, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fish) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 2-C (Lower Lehigh River). As per the Department's current listing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than is designated use.

The facility is a 1.9 million square foot warehouse that manufactures and bottles juice. Industrial activity that is exposed to stormwater consists of trucking and vehicle traffic and runoff from building roofs. The site consists of multiple storm-resistant shelters. All other industrial activity takes place inside the warehouse.

Anti-degradation module was included with the applications. BMPs on-site consist of vegetation to reduce dust and particulates generated, covered waste containers, visual inspections, and infill basins.

The facility's SIC code is 2033 (Canned, Frozen, and Preserved Fruits, Vegetables, and Food Specialties) and falls under Appendix I monitoring requirements of the PAG03 General Permit. Appendix I of the latest PAG03 general permit includes benchmark values for pH, 5-Day Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD5), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), and Oil and Grease.

Benchmark values are not effluent limitations, and exceedances do not constitute permit violations. However, if the permittee's sampling demonstrates exceedances of benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods, the permittee shall take action in accordance with the permit.

The PPC plan is updated and in effect as of 6/30/2023. The SPCC plan is updated and in effect as of 8/20/2019.

Summary of Review

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit. The date of the last inspection at this facility was April 1, 2024 with no noted violations. There are no open violations that would warrant the withholding of the issuance of this permit. Recommend approval.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
