Summary of Review

The applicant is requesting renewal of an NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with an industrial activity to Mill Creek (HQ-CWF, MF) in State Water Plan Basin 01-E. The receiving body does not have an existing use classification. The receiving body is not impaired, and the discharge is not expected to affect public water supplies.

The facility manufactures airplane parts and has been present on the site since 1990.

The stormwater is directed to the west of facility as sheet-flow and discharges into Mill creek via two outfalls, (001) and (002). Outfall 001 is the representative outfall, so it is the only one sampled.

Permittee consultant submitted corrected coordinates outfalls and are as follows:

(001): 41,1695, -75.2585
 (002): 41.1690, -75.2594

This facility is classified under SIC code 3578 which corresponds to Appendix J in the PAG-03 (2023) General Permit. Sampling/ reporting is for pH, Oil & Grease, 5-days Biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD), Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Total nitrogen And Total phosphorus. Benchmarks exist for pH, TSS, COD and Oil & Grease.

Benchmark values are not effluent limitations, and exceedances do not constitute permit violations. However, if the permittee's sampling demonstrates exceedances of benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods, the permittee shall take action in accordance with Part C. V. F. of the permit. A corrective action plan must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceeds the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

Summary of Review

A corrective action plan (CAP) must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceeds the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

According to stormwater sampling results submitted with this renewal application, there are no exceedances to be reported across all pollutants of concern included in Appendix J. Also, the previous monitoring/ reporting for Total Toxics Organics (TTO) is not a requirement under new Appendix J of PAG03 (2023), therefore it will be removed from the current permit.

pH limit of (6.0- 9.0) as IMAX is added in this current permit as per chapter 95.2.for Industrial waste dischargers.

The permittee submitted a PPC Plan updated September 2025. The plan confirmed only few metals activities such- as CNC milling, cutting & machining, brazing and painting are happening indoors and in controlled environment.

A compliance evaluation Inspection was performed by department staff December12, 2021, and there were no violations noted.

WMS Query by client report was run March12, 2026 and it did not return any violations.

Public Participation

DEP violations of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
