**Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting a new NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to Iron Run, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fish) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 2-C (Lower Lehigh River). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

Stormwater flow from roofs and paved areas is directed to detention basin. Discharge from the detention basin has not been observed.

Client contact person was missing from the GIF form. The information was received by email on August 19, 2024.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 4225 (Trans. & Utilities – General Warehousing and Storage) and falls under **Appendix L** monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit. **Appendix L** of the latest (2023) PAG-03 permit includes semiannual sampling/reporting for Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, Total suspended Solids (TSS) and Oil & Grease. Benchmarks exist for Oil & Grease and TSS.

Benchmark values are not effluent limitations, and exceedances do not constitute permit violations. However, if the permittee's sampling demonstrates exceedances of benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods, the permittee shall take action in accordance with Part C. V. F. of the permit. A corrective action plan must be submitted to DEP if the discharge concentration for the parameters exceeds the benchmark values for two or more consecutive monitoring periods.

A site inspection was performed on April 26, 2022 no noncompliance were observed.

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### Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
