**Summary of Review**

The applicant is requesting a new NPDES permit to discharge stormwater associated with industrial activity to McMichael Creek, a HQ-CWF, MF (High Quality-Cold Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes) designated receiving stream in state water plan basin 1-E (Brodhead Creek). As per the Department's current existing use list, the receiving stream does not have an existing use classification that is more protective than its designated use.

The site was previously an auto recycling/scrap operation facility and had an NPDES permit (PAR602248) for the discharge of stormwater associated with industrial activities from September 7, 2010 to August 4, 2016. Alpha Recycling HWY 80, Inc. purchased the site and plans to perform site improvements and ultimately conduct automobile recycling operations.

A site visit occurred on July 23, 2019 with the Department, the permittee, and the permittee's consultant. Please note that no stormwater outfalls were identified during the site visit. The coordinates provided for Outfall 001 correlate to a low topographic location hydraulically down gradient of the proposed operation areas. Surface water sheet flow samples should be collected from this location. Sampling results were not included with the permit application due to lack of a rainfall event significant enough to produce a sheet flow sample at the low point and due to need to obtain the permit as soon as possible so operations at the site can begin. It was agreed during the site visit that providing stormwater data with the permit application was preferable, but because the site was existing the application could be processed if samples could not be reasonably obtained.

If a distinct stormwater outfall is observed or created by site improvements, the Department shall be notified.

The facility is categorized by SIC code 5093 (Wholesale Trade – Scrap and Waste Materials) and falls under Appendix P monitoring requirements of the PAG-03 General Permit.

Appendix P of the latest PAG-03 General Permit includes benchmark values for Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Oil &

### Summary of Review

Grease, and Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD). All industries classified under Appendix P should be within the following values: 100 mg/L for TSS, 30 mg/L for Oil & Grease, and 120 mg/L for COD. These values are included as IMAX limitations and should be sampled semi-annually. Semi-annual monitoring and reporting for pH is also required under this permit.

PPC Plan implementation and completion of an annual inspection and compliance evaluation are required under the permit.

There are no open violations for this client that would warrant withholding the issuance of this permit.

#### Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
