Internal Review and Recommendations

On October 24, 2025 a Draft NPDES Permit was issued to Air Products and Chemicals Inc (Gardener Cryogenics – A Division of Air Products and Chemicals). Per the original fact sheet and correspondence with the permittee it was agreed upon that Outfall 001 would be the representative outfall of the site. In Part A of the NPDES Permit, it was incorrectly written that Outfall 002 would have effluent limit reporting requirements.

In both permits, this language was included in Part C of the NPDES Permit under Stormwater Monitoring Requirements:

“The permittee shall conduct monitoring of its stormwater discharges at the representative outfalls identified in Part A of this permit. The permittee shall document stormwater sampling event information and no exposure conditions for each calendar year on the Annual Report required by Part A III.C.1”

The correct effluent reporting requirements are now in the NPDES Redrafted Permit with the correct comments describing the monitoring requirements for each outfall. The proper language for representative outfalls is located in Part C of the Permit underneath *Stormwater Monitoring Requirements*.

The permit will be posted for 30 days in the PA Bulletin again.
