**Internal Review and Recommendations**

The City of Scranton has applied for a MS4 IP renewal. The City's population is approximately 76,328, is the largest City in Northeastern Pennsylvania and the sixth largest City in Pennsylvania. Receiving waters include The Lackawanna River, Roaring Brook, Leggetts creek, Meadow Brook, Leach Creek, Lucky Run, Keyser Creek, Lindy Creek and an Unnamed tributary to Stafford Meadow Brook.

The City's MS4 Permit requirements include Pollutant Control Measure Appendix A for AMD Metals and pH; Appendix B for Pathogens; Pollution Prevention Plans Appendix D for discharge within the Chesapeake Bay; and Appendix E for discharge to locally impaired waters. These requirements are in addition to the standard six minimum control measures that all Phase 2 MS4s must adhere to.

After consideration of parsing, the City will be required to remove 283,055 lbs. of sediment annually. The City has selected stream restoration, street sweeping and inlet cleaning as BMPs to implement in a effort to achieve their MS4 goal.

Public Participation

DEP will publish notice of the receipt of the NPDES permit application and a tentative decision to issue the individual NPDES permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82. Upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, DEP will accept written comments from interested persons for a 30-day period (which may be extended for one additional 15-day period at DEP's discretion), which will be considered in making a final decision on the application. Any person may request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the application. A public hearing may be held if DEP determines that there is significant public interest in holding a hearing. If a hearing is held, notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior to the hearing and in at least one newspaper of general circulation within the geographical area of the discharge.
